IMMEDIATE OPENING!

The Lift Maintenance Manager directs all maintenance activities of the Lifts department. This position must also serve as head lift mechanic and ensures proper operation and maintenance of all chairlifts.

Responsibilities:

- Maintain all lift equipment, specifically two CTec Doppelmayr fixed-grip triple chairlifts and a multi-lift recreational rope tow system for tubing.
- Responsible for overall direction, coordination, and evaluation of lift maintenance department.
- Schedule routine and preventative maintenance as needed.
- Ensure company meets all ANSI, USFS, and other Federal requirements regarding lifts.
- Facilitate all annual and seasonal inspections and testing according to both Insurance and Federal requirements.
- Ensure operations are conducted in accordance with Company safety program and focused on providing a safe work environment.
- Maintain inventory control and order parts and supplies as necessary with management approval.
- Assure that all records are maintained and kept up to date, including all mechanical and operational procedures, daily maintenance, operational logs, etc.
- Manage the preparation and maintenance of reports necessary to carry out the functions of the department. Prepare periodic reports for management, as necessary or as requested.
- Communicate regularly and effectively with other department managers, general manager, and other designated contacts within the organization.
- Assist with other departments in performing duties whenever necessary.
- Perform duties of lift mechanic and operator as needed.
- Carry out other various maintenance procedures as assigned or requested by the General Manager and/or Owners.
- Perform minor repairs and maintenance on other facility equipment and appliances as necessary.
- Assist in problem resolution in an effort to minimize equipment downtime.
- Look for opportunities to continually improve maintenance processes and lift operations efficiency.
- Work with all Company personnel in a cooperative and professional manner.
- Duties during winter operating season include assisting with regularly scheduled maintenance, preoperational, mid-day, weekly, and monthly inspections as well as responding to lift breakdowns.
- Off-season duties include a thorough inspection of all lift components, tower work, and grip and chair maintenance.
- Work on hydraulic systems, braking systems, rigging, gasoline and diesel engines, as well as low voltage circuits.



Requirements:

- Knowledge of hydraulic systems, braking systems, rigging, gasoline and diesel engines, as well as low voltage safety circuits preferred. Mechanical, and some electrical, experience required.
- Demonstrate adequate mechanical aptitude.
- Fixed grip lift experience is a plus.
- Must be able to work under timelines and pressure.
- Must possess and maintain a valid driver's license.
- Proficient in the proper use of, and care of, various power and hand tools.
- Good verbal and written communication skills in English.
- Ability to comprehend and follow directions, perform basic math, good time management and team member skills.
- Must be able and willing to work independently as well as part of a larger team.
- Typical Physical Activity Standing, sitting, walking, bending, stooping, reaching, twisting, kneeling, working in confined areas, reaching overhead, driving and operating heavy equipment, grasping, moving equipment, pushing, pulling, lifting and carrying 50lbs.
- Typical Environmental Conditions Inside and outside areas of a typical ski and summer resort facility, which includes working with and around large machinery, extreme variations in temperature, noise, odors, humidity, dust, in general offices or on outside grounds. This job may require the ability to climb and work at substantial heights (necessary fall protection provided) and work in all kinds of weather.
- Travel Requirements Occasionally, such as to procure necessary parts or to travel to training/conferences.
- Requires working on weekends and holidays.

Skills and Qualifications:

- Extensive mechanical/electrical maintenance knowledge, and 1 to 3 years of successful experience.
- Working knowledge of all types of electrical equipment including DC motors, DC variable speed drives, battery powered low voltage 24VDC controls.
- Able to read basic electrical schematics and understand symbols and many different manufacturer schematic layouts.
- Comfortable using heavy equipment, power tools, hand tools, line equipment, rigging, and electrical equipment.
- Intermediate or better proficiency in downhill skiing or snowboarding and ability to operate a snowmobile and/or ATV.
- Ability to work on elevated structures, outside, and under inclement weather.
- Ability to read, analyze, and interpret technical journals and legal documents.
- Excellent communication, leadership, analytical, and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to lead and direct employees, serve customers, and maintain excellent customer service during high stress situations.
- Highly organized and able to adapt quickly to changing priorities.
- Demonstrated ability to serve as a knowledgeable resource to the organization's management team.
- Good computer skills in a Microsoft Windows environment to include, but not be limited to, Excel and Word.
- Ability to maintain a high level of confidentiality.
- Maintain a valid Driver's License.
- Welding and fabrication experience a plus, but not required.



Education and/or Experience:

- One to Three years lift maintenance experience preferred.
- Supervisory/management/leadership experience preferred.
- Expertise of mechanical concepts and principles, as related to hydraulics, lubrications, power transmission, rotating machinery, and electricity.
- Familiarity with ANSI standards and Federal regulations.
- Knowledge of the ski industry in general.

Physical Requirements and Working Conditions: The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to walk, talk, see, hear and smell. The employee is frequently required to handle objects, tools, or controls. Must be capable of walking or standing 90% or more of a normal 8 to 10 hour work shift and lifting and moving up to 100 lbs. Must be able to walk on uneven terrain and on snow and ice, shovel snow, bend, climb, and stoop for extended periods of time. Must be physically able to climb vertical ladders. Frequently required to reach with hands and arms; climb or balance; and stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl. Specific vision abilities required by this job include depth perception.

All job opportunities are located at White Pine Ski Resort, located 10 miles from the town of Pinedale, Wyoming, in the Wind River Mountains.
