White Pine Resort is looking for hardworking team players who enjoy the outdoors and are interested in the perks that working at a ski resort brings! Position Reports To:

Ski Patrol Director

General Purpose:

To provide for and ensure a reasonably safe skiing environment for our guests and fellow employees.

Wage & Status: Wage depends on experience and certifications. Full and part time, seasonal, positions. Volunteers are also welcome if meet minimum requirements.

Essential Functions:

- To provide medical assistance and evacuation, skier safety, search and rescue support, trail efforts, lift evacuation, if necessary, duty station responsibilities, equipment maintenance, and other assigned duties.
- Each task requires a high level of decision making.

Basic Requirements:

- American Heart Association First Aid/CPR/AED, Wilderness First Responder (or similar Outdoor Emergency Care training) and strong alpine skiing/boarding skills are minimum requirements.
- Must be able to lift and carry toboggans weighing as much as 70 lbs.
- Other tasks include skiing in difficult conditions, working in cold and often inclement conditions, high elevations, carrying and transporting unwieldy materials such as tower pads, medical equipment, etc.
- Must not have any current physical limitations which would prevent you from carrying out the duties expected of a capable patroller.
- Must be able to hear and speak clearly in order to hear radio calls, skiers requesting assistance, and for communication to occur using radios and telephones.
- All Ski Patrol staff are responsible for keeping aid rooms and patrol dispatch areas clean and organized.
- A high level of responsibility and reliability are also required.



Preferred Experience & Skills:

- Previous patrolling experience, mountaineering, search & rescue, or experience within the medical field.
- Mountaineering skills with technical rope experience preferred.
- Industry experience, i.e. ski instructor, lift operator, trail crew also preferred, but not necessary.
- Knowledge of White Pine Ski Area preferred but not required.

Note: This description is not intended to be an exhaustive list of all duties, responsibilities, or qualifications associated with the job.

All job opportunities are located at White Pine Ski Resort, located 10 miles from the town of Pinedale, Wyoming, in the Wind River Mountains of the Bridger-Teton National Forest. Most of our winter seasonal positions are Fridays through Mondays, usually from the end of November through to the end of March (except for the Christmas/New Year holiday break, which is approx. 18 days straight). Reliable, winter transportation is a must! **Housing can be provided** if needed (employment dependent).
